At the first of each month, we go through our expenditures and plug the numbers into our budget. We also look at up coming expenditures and what we need to do to ensure we have the money for them. It works great! And it doesn’t take that much time.

Not only does it help our finances – we are saving and giving more money – we are growing *together*! There is intimacy in working together on the finances. We both know what is going on with the finances and we both have input about how we are going to spend – or not spend – the money the Lord has given us. Amos 3:3 asks, “Do two walk together unless they have agreed to do so?” Finances are a huge part of our lives, as demonstrated by the 2,300 references to money and possessions in the Bible. Working together as a couple is critical to navigating through the many financial decisions we must make regularly. Work together as a couple, make a plan, set a budget, and grow together in this area. You will be blessed financially and in your marriage.
